FUTURE POLICIES AND PROCESSES: WHICH SHOULD WE PRIORITIZE?

- I. **Metadata maintenance:** how metadata are maintained and made available, including through a data dictionary and a data collection calendar
- 2. Master data management: how the data governance program determines and documents the source of record for enterprise data elements contained in more than one source
- 3. **Data matching:** guidelines and procedure for matching data from different source systems, including quality controls to reduce over- and under-matching
- 4. **Data collection:** how data are prepared and submitted to the data system, including the timeline and resources required
- 5. **Data quality:** how the organization will ensure that data are accurate, complete, timely, and relevant to stakeholder needs, including error reporting and data validation
- 6. **Procurement:** data and technical components of procurements of significant scope are reviewed and identified by data governance and IT and are addressed in alignment with data governance principles and IT standards
- 7. Data scope: data that will be included in the data system based on the system's intended users and uses
- 8. Data refresh: how and how often data are updated in the data system
