Income Security

Public Assistance-Temporary Assistance for Needy Families

Unemployment Insurance Benefits

Health Insurance

You may qualify for HUSKY, the state's Medicaid health insurance by visiting www.connect.ct.gov/access/Home.jsp

If you need health insurance due to the loss of a job or if you meet income guidelines, contact Access Health CT at 1-855-805-4325.

Utilities and Fuel Delivery

CT banned all utility shut offs during the crisis. Families facing shutoff or whose utilities were shutoff should call the Public Utility Authority (PURA) at 1-800-382-4586.

Energy Assistance/ Fuel Oil
