<u>Committee Updates:</u> All committees have had their deadlines for new business pass, but certain committees will continue to meet as bills are referred to them from the House or Senate chambers.

BILLS OF INTEREST

Relevant bills to DCF that have seen activity in the Senate and House since our last update are below.

SB 125 - AN ACT CONCERNING THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF CHILDREN AND FAMILIES RELATIVE TO IDENTIFIED ADOPTIONS AND REVISIONS TO CERTAIN TERMINOLOGY

The bill was referred from the Senate to the Judiciary committee, where it still currently sits in committee.

HB 5382 AN ACT CONCERNING THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE OFFICE OF THE CHILD ADVOCATE

The bill was amended and passed out of the House.

The bill was amended with House Schedule A LCO# 3881 (J).

HB 5262 AN ACT CONCERNING A SEXUAL ABUSE AND ASSAULT SURVEY

The bill was amended, passed out of the House and sent to the Senate.

The bill was amended with House Schedule A LCO# 4122 (J).

SB 127 AN ACT CONCERNING THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF CHILDREN AND FAMILIES RELATING TO BACKGROUND CHECKS, CERTAIN SUBSIDIES, URGENT CRISIS CENTERS, DEPARTMENTAL RECORDS AND SPECIAL POLICE OFFICERS.

The bill passed the senate and was sent to the House.

SB 126 AN ACT CONCERNING IN-PERSON HOME VISITS BY THE DEPARTMENT OF CHILDREN AND FAMILIES.

The bill was amended, passed out of the Senate and sent to the House.

The bill was amended with Senate Schedule A LCO# 3687 (D).

HB 5382 AN ACT CONCERNING THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE OFFICE OF THE CHILD ADVOCATE.

The bill was amended, passed out of the House and sent to the Senate.

The bill was amended with House Schedule A LCO# 3881 (J).

HB 5506 AN ACT CONCERNING FAMILIES WITH SERVICE NEEDS.

The bill was referred from the House to the Appropriations committee, where it currently sits in committee.

HB 5508 AN ACT CONCERNING RECOMMENDATIONS FROM THE JUVENILE JUSTICE POLICY AND OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE.

The bill was voted out of the Appropriations committee and back to the House after being referred to that committee from the House after originally being voted out of the Judiciary committee.
