Welcome to the seventeenth edition of the DCF Legislative Update for the 2025 session of the General Assembly.

Committee Deadlines:

All committee deadlines have now passed. However, several committees will still hold meetings to address bills that have been referred to their committee from the House or Senate.

The most notable committees that will continue to hold meetings will be the Appropriations committee, Finance, Revenue and Bonding Committee and Judiciary Committee.

The bills they will address have already passed out of at least one committee and/or it's committee of origin.

<u>Adjournment</u>: The General Assembly Adjourns on June 4th at midnight.
