<u>Committee Deadlines:</u> The committee deadline for raised bills and for a subject matter public hearing on proposed bills is Tuesday February 18<sup>th</sup>.

<u>Adjournment</u>: The General Assembly Adjourns on June 4th at midnight, which is later than in even numbered years due to the State Biennium budget adoption taking place in the odd numbered years.
