Welcome to the seventh edition of the DCF Legislative Update for the 2025 session of the General Assembly.

<u>Committee Deadlines:</u> The committee bill deadline (subject matter public hearing held on proposed bill) is tomorrow Saturday February 22nd.

<u>Adjournment</u>: The General Assembly Adjourns on June 4th at midnight, which is later than in even numbered years due to the State Biennium budget adoption taking place in the odd numbered years.

Budget Hearings

Please submit written testimony using the On-line Testimony Submission Form. The Committee requests that testimony be limited to matters related to the items on the Agenda. The first hour of the hearing is reserved for Legislators, Constitutional Officers, State Agency Heads and Chief Elected Municipal Officials. Speakers will be limited to three minutes of testimony. The Committee encourages witnesses to submit a written statement and to condense oral

testimony to a summary of that statement. All public hearing testimony, written and spoken, is public information. As such, it will be made available on the CGA website and indexed by internet search engines.
