 - 1) Merger of RAC and the Regional Implementation Team (RIT)
 - 2) Reviews structure and gives governance on how policy and practice are implemented
 - 3) Development of different models of participation, through general members and governing members, in order to garner greater participation:
 - i. General members as those individuals that expressed interest in RAC and attends some meetings
 - ii. Governing members as those individuals who can vote on matters presented at RAC and which will have an impact on how policies an practices are implemented
 - iii. Recruitment of members will be ongoing
 - 4) Development of an Executive Team
 - i. This committee will work with the subcommittee and help move the agenda forward so that activities are accomplished and goals are met
 - ii. It is proposed that the Executive Team consist of Michael Williams, the two area directors, Wayne Johnson, Beth Landolina, the two RAC co-chairs (Ivy and Sarah) and Regina Roundtree
 - 5) Review of subcommittees
 - i. The purpose of the subcommittees are to capture activities in the community
 - ii. Each subcommittee will develop measurable outcome goals
 - iii. Each subcommittee will look at developing a mission statement and/or value statement
 - iv. The State Advisory Committee and Casey Family will look at various structures of existing subcommittee and respective bylaws and will report back on their findings and recommendations
 - v. If needed, each subcommittee can develop and ad-hoc committee to look at specific issue
 - 6) Review of proposed subcommittees
 - i. See DRAFT Region IV Regional Advisory Council Subcommittees that was distributed at the meeting
 - ii. Meeting participants were encouraged to complete Membership Form and identify a subcommittee they would like to participate in.
