

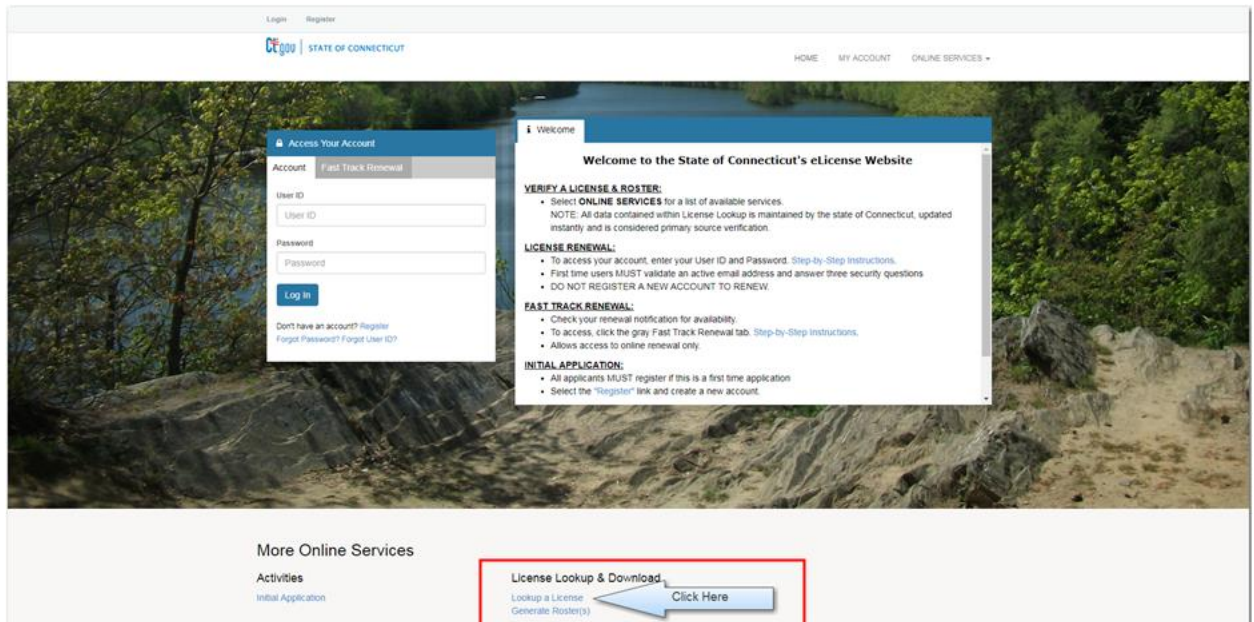

Instructions to Verify Electronic Prescribing of Controlled Substances (EPCS) Exemptions

1. Go to www.elicense.ct.gov
2. Select "Lookup a License"



3. Enter practitioner's information (first name, last name, license number, and/or license type)
Select "Search"
