- Media Release CT Labor Dept. Issues Stop Work Orders At Trinity College Construction Site in Hartford, April 25, 2013

Richard Maloney, Director of Trade Practices, appeared before the Board to report to the Board the findings regarding this Stop Work Order, especially as it pertains to Covenant Fire Sprinkler and the possibility of unlicensed workers and permit holders. Director Maloney stated that he has not yet confirmed whether or not there were unlicensed workers on this job site. He is in contact with the Department of Labor and they will be supplying Director Maloney with their report once it is completed. At that time, the Trade Practices Division will open a

case file in order to further investigate the matter and impose any possible civil or criminal penalties or initiate hearings.

In the past year, there has only been one complaint in the area of fire protection, and that complaint is still open at this time. There have been no violations.

It was noted that there was a recent job posting for a consumer protection inspector. The Board is concerned that this posting does not include the fire protection license holder position. Director Maloney confirmed that this was an error and that a fire protection tradesman or contractor can apply for this position.

Director Richard Maloney also confirmed that complaints can be made by persons other than the consumer.

 Achieving Proper Enforcement for Occupational Trade Licenses Meeting May 7, 2013

Chairperson David Waskowicz attended this meeting, as well as representatives from other boards. At this meeting, a proposal was drafted to form a task force in order to achieve proper enforcement.
