MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

The Board reviewed the draft minutes from the September 13, 2018 Heating, Piping, Cooling and Sheet Metal Work Examining Board meeting and voted unanimously to approve as written.

COMMENTS OR CONCERNS OF ANY PERSON PRESENT TODAY:

Neal Alderman, New Haven, CT – S-2 Unlimited Journeyperson application

Mr. Alderman's S-2 application was denied on August 16, 2018 due to lack of proof of apprenticeship completion or notarized statements from employers showing dates and duties of employment under the supervision of a person holding the proper contractor license for the on the job work experience. After a review of the application documents and discussion with Mr. Alderman, the Board was in agreement that this application cannot be approved due to lack of proof of the required 8,000 hours of on the job training as a registered apprentice.

Julianne Avallone, DCP Legal Director, informed Mr. Alderman that, from this point forward, he should not engage in any work that falls under the definition of heating, piping, cooling, and sheet metal work such as the S-2 license category, unless he is doing so as a properly registered apprentice, as this would be a violation of law and DCP is now on notice of his unlicensed and unregistered activities.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Proposed bill to modify the definition of work as it pertains to occupational licensing, specifically in the areas of testing and inspecting, as defined in Section 20-330, Chapter 393 of the Connecticut General Statutes.

3. Review of Department of Labor (DOL) referral letter used by the Department of Consumer Protection (DCP) for processing of applications

The Board was provided with a copy of this letter for review. Todd Berch was present and provided an overview of DOL's procedures for processing applications, such as the procedure for conducting the comparative analysis for related instruction and on the job training for applications.

4. Presentation of enforcement case by Paulette Annon

Paulette Annon presented a summary of a case that involves a licensee that holds an S-1 and P-1 license, and permitting issues that arose when doing work on a home. The case was presented to the Board anonymously. The Department is seeking the Board's input before issuing an AVC (Assurance of Voluntary Compliance) to the respondent. The Department's proposal is to impose a \$500 penalty for commencing work before there was a permit in place for the remainder of the work, and cease and desist from any further violations of doing unpermitted work.

The Board voted unanimously to approve the agreement and penalties as outlined by the Department.

CORRESPONDENCE:

1. Email regarding the installation of a residential mini-split HVAC system from Lee Vormelker dated September 27, 2018.

The Board reviewed this email from Mr. Vormelker stating his concerns. Mr. Vormelker's latest email communication indicated that a discussion with the Board will no longer be necessary. The Board ruled that this work requires licensure.

1. The Board received a complaint report for the period of 8/29/18 to 10/26/18 via email prior to the meeting for review. Pamela Brown and Janita Hamel were in attendance and responded to the Board's questions regarding this report.
