Melissa Sheffy, Plumbing and Piping Work Examining Board Member The issue of whether or not the installation and servicing of radiant ceiling panels is licensable work was discussed at the January 13, 2022 Heating, Piping, Cooling and Sheet Metal Work Examining Board meeting. Melissa Sheffy was in attendance at today's meeting to discuss and receive clarification regarding licensure for radiant ceiling panels.

DCP INVESTIGATION DIVISION COMPLAINT STATUS REPORT:

The Board reviewed the complaint report dated 1-1-22 to 2-28-22 submitted by the Investigations Division.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Substitute House Bill No. 6100 - Public Act 21-37 - An Act Concerning Department of Consumer Protection Licensing and Enforcement, Antitrust Issues, and the Palliative Use of Marijuana and Revisions to the Liquor Control Act

The Board has expressed their concern regarding changes to Connecticut General Statutes, Chapter 393 requiring written contracts meeting certain specifications for work on private residential property by licensed tradespersons and the right to cancel timeframe prior to performing work.

DCP has revised the language in this Bill and it is being addressed as part of House Bill 5151 - An Act Concerning the Department of Consumer Protection's Recommendations Regarding Homemaker-Companion Agencies, Contractors, Heating Fuel, Food Establishments, Continuing Education, and Appraisals.

Board so noted.

2. Continued review of out of state occupational trade licenses for determination of equivalency to Connecticut occupational trade licenses

A. At the February 1, 2022 Application Review Working Group Meeting, it was determined that the following license types are equivalent:

Out of state license type Connecticut License Type

Rockland County Licensed Mechanical Contractor

CT S-1

The Application Review Working Group continues to discuss and determine the equivalency of out of state licenses as compared to Connecticut licenses.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Application Review Working Group

The Application Review Working Group continues to review applications on a monthly basis for approval to sit for license exams.

2. Application Review – Michael Gravel – S-1 Application

A motion was made by David Foster, seconded by John Higgins to approve Mr. Gravel's application for the S-1 license exam based on having held a D-2 license for 14 years. The motion passed three to one.

3. Application Review – Michael Ifferte – S-1 Application

A motion was made by Cameron Champlin, seconded by John Higgins to deny Mr. Ifferte's application for the S-1 license exam due to lack of required related instruction for the S-2/S-1 license category. The motion passed unanimously.
