REPORT FROM SUB-COMMITTEES:

LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE:

1. Discussion regarding revision to DCP enforcement powers

The Board has become increasingly concerned about DCP's enforcement powers due to the pending complaints with DCP against Country Mobile Estates and Oakridge Gardens Mobile Home Park. Bennett Pudlin spoke about the Council's concerns that Oakridge Gardens Mobile Home Park went unlicensed for a long period of time without any action being taken, and that Country Mobile Home Estates had outstanding orders for repairs that were not followed up on in a timely manner and lead to egregious conditions and placed the residents in a dangerous situation. The Council feels that DCP was not able to act effectively in these two emergency situations, and the Legislative Committee met to review the enforcement powers DCP has now, and ways in which they may be improved through statutory changes.

Rafie Podlosky reviewed and summarized the statute changes that were proposed at the Legislative Committee meeting. Council members, as well as guests, had the opportunity to provide input regarding these proposed changes.

Bennett Pudlin will provide Council members with an updated draft of proposed statute changes before the December meeting.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Julianne Avallone, Legal Division Director, attended to provide an update on the status of Country Mobile Estates and Oakridge Gardens Mobile Home Park complaints pending with DCP Legal Division

Country Mobile Estates:

Julianne Avallone reported that negotiations continue between DCP and Country Mobile Estates. A hearing is scheduled with the DCP Legal Division in November. This hearing will take place unless a settlement agreeable to department is executed prior to the hearing, at which the Department may seek penalties, suspension, or revocation of licensure.

Oakridge Gardens Mobile Home Park:

Julianne Avallone reported that the Oakridge Gardens Mobile Home Park matter was referred to the Attorney General's Office by the Department. A pre-licensure consent order between the Department and the Executrix of the estate of which Oakridge is a part was signed and executed on August 21, 2019. This order addresses the issue of the removal of trees that may pose a danger to residents, as well as other concerns with including water issues and collection of rent. Oakridge Gardens, LLC was issued a license on September 11, 2019 and must adhere to conditions set forth in the pre-licensure consent order.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Hartford Courant article dated September 8, 2019 regarding Country Mobile Estates
