Connecticut State Board of Accountancy December 04, 2007 Minutes

Chairman Reynolds called the meeting to order at 8:35 A.M. in the second floor conference room, 30 Trinity Street, Connecticut.

Motion made by Michael Weinshel and seconded by Richard Sturdevant to accept and approve the minutes of the November 06, 2007 State Board of Accountancy meeting; All voted in favor, except Richard Bond, Richard Gesseck, Leonard Romaniello who abstained.

In a continued discussion of the Mobility Legislation, representatives from the Accountants Coalition and NASBA were both present to assist Attorney Adams in her analysis of the proposed legislation:

The issue, as explained by attorney Adams, before the Board this morning is what they would like to accomplish out of mobility. In an effort to explain mobility further, she went on to explain the following points:

- O The UAA Model is based on substantial equivalency under NASBA'S definitions; CPA's will have the ability to perform work as a license holder but won't have to go through the sometimes strenuous application process.
- O As long as a firm is practicing through someone with a practice privilege they don't have to necessarily get a firm permit.
- O Under the UAA Model, individuals consent to jurisdiction by simply coming into Connecticut to practice.

In her summation, Attorney Adams explained to the Board the issue at hand boils down to whether they are going to accept the UAA model, or whether there are other options they would like to exercise.

- o Furthermore, Attorney Adams ensured board members by accepting mobility the Board's ability to take action against a licensee, firm, or individual who practices within our jurisdiction would not be diminished.
- o Individuals will be held accountable here in terms of their practice privileges then they would be referred to their home state. The hope is for other state boards to take any action against an individual's practice privileges seriously.
- o In order to serve the best interests of the public the board will be relying on the cooperation from all boards involved.

The Board would still like to introduce this new legislation during the 2008 Legislative Session.

Mr. Gold is accused of defrauding an elderly client out of \$13,500. The matter was reported to the Hamden Police and a suit was brought in New Haven Superior Court as a civil matter. A compliance meeting was held March 6, 2007 which Mr. Gold did not attend. The status of the civil suit is not entirely clear. However, the on line record appears to indicate some sort of judgment has been rendered against Mr. Gold in the matter. Mr. Gold has refused to claim any of the certified mail directed to him regarding this matter. New complaints also indicate that this situation is not isolated incident.
