686th Session Board of Examiners for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors June 12, 2007

The scheduled meeting of June 12, 2007 was held at the Board Office, 165 Capitol Avenue, Room 117 in the State Office Building, Hartford, Connecticut.

Anthony L D'Andrea, Chairman called the meeting to order at 9:15 am.

Attending the meeting were John DeWolf (1) PE, John Hallisey (2) PE, Terry McCarthy (3) PE Anthony L D'Andrea (4) PELS, Robert L Doane (5) PELS.

Absent was Rocco V Laraia (8) PM.

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William O Giel (10) LS and Curtiss B Smith (11) LS and Robert W Grossenbacher (12) were excused due to lack of surveying business

There are three vacancies on the Board.

Also present were Steven Schwane, attorney for the Department of Consumer Protection, Peter Huntsman, Asst. Attorney General and Barbara Syp-Maziarz, Board Administrator.

Legal Division

Legislative update-Robert Dahn reported that the legislative proposal did not go through due to several factors: (1) Even though both committee chairs were in agreement with the bill, it was not clear, who would introduce the bill. Both chairs were laboring under the assumption that the other one would present the bill, which created a glitch from the beginning that was eventually resolved, where the specific language did not get introduced into the bill. Fortunately, a public hearing was held where the language was inserted into the bill. (2)General Law committee failed to get their bills posted in time, which meant that 10% of their bills did not go anywhere. This meant that we had to amend our legislation to an existing bill that had some sort of generic connection.

Mr. Dahn stated that there are meetings set up for next month, but has a concern that there may be a problem with the language, which no one has stepped up to say.

Mr. Hallisey stated that when he spoke to one of the senators on the general law committee, the senator stated that the language itself never got a public hearing. Even though it was presented at the hearing, it wasn't in the actual bill at the time and without the public hearing on the language, the legislative proposal would not get out of general law.

Mr. Dahn stated that Jerry Padula, the legislative liaison for the department, will join in the early meetings and by doing that, it will help iron out the specific language. Atty. Schwane will also work with Mr. Padula.

F-2 Hearing-Docket 07-402 in the matter of Pool Engineers, LLC (Dist. 2)

The hearing proceeded at 9:50 am in room 117 of the State Office Building, 165 Capitol Avenue, Hartford, CT and ended at 10:34 am.

The Board held their deliberations after the hearing and concluded that all allegations were proven. The Board noted that the respondent company performs a good solid business, but unfortunately, the name and description of his company conveys the impression that they offer engineering services, which they do not hold a license to do so.

Motion made by (2) seconded by (5) to move to issue an order of immediate discontinuance pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes, Section 20-307a and 21a-7(2), that all the allegations of the complaint have been proven. Motion carried.

Atty. Huntsman will forward a draft of the Board's decision and options for the Board's review and approval.

F-3 Hearing-Docket 07-403 in the matter of Innovative Engineered Systems, LLC a/k/a Innovative Engineered Systems, Inc and Innovative Systems (Dist. 2)

Atty. Schwane stated that Chairman D'Andrea, on behalf of the Engineering Board signed the administrative complaint to schedule a hearing. This matter was brought to the attention of Commissioner Farrell, who felt that this was an advertising issue, and asked Atty. Schwane to seek under the Unfair Trade Practice Act, an assurance of voluntary compliance. Atty. Schwane stated that the advertising, which was exclusively on the website, was taken down. Atty. Schwane presented the Board an assurance of voluntary compliance signed by Commissioner Farrell, which is an agreement form, where they agree to cease and desist from advertising engineering services and from using the terms and descriptions including engineer, engineering and engineered. Atty. Schwane stated that if the company was to violate this agreement, this can be brought to the Attorney General's office to any institute civil penalties. Therefore, based on this agreement, Atty. Schwane requested the Board to withdraw this complaint.

Motion made by (2) seconded by (3) to withdraw this complaint. Motion carried.

G-Other Items

Atty. Jerry Padula introduced himself as the legislative liaison for the Department of Consumer Protection along with Atty. Jim McCann who is the newest member of our legal division.

Chairman D'Andrea advised Atty. Padula that the Board has been working on getting their legislative changes for the past 10 years, and at today's meeting was advised that there was no public hearing for the language of the bill and asked Atty. Padula to explain why this hearing did not occur.

Mr. Padula stated that when the bill was drafted it was presented and goes through a law review within the office and then reviewed by the Governor's office and the Office of Policy and Management (OPM) who allows the department to introduce legislation. Chairman D'Andrea assumed that the Board's bill was not presented this way in this last session, which Mr. Padula confirmed.

Mr. Padula stated that it is the chairperson's call of the general law committee whether to go forward to a public hearing.

Chairman D'Andrea asked Mr. Padula if the Department would support the bill and help guide the Board through this process, which Mr. Padula stated that he would assist the Board.

Mr. DeWolf stated that this legislative proposal is so significant because our current regulations are so out of date that we are waiting for a disaster to happen before

anyone considers these changes. Mr. DeWolf explained that the Board put in a lot time and work into developing these changes to match the National Model Law. Mr. DeWolf stated that the Board is disappointed that the Department has not supported the Board in the last 10 years in regards to the Board's proposed legislations.

Chairman D'Andrea concurred with Mr. DeWolf and stated that the Department of "Consumer Protection" should connote a need to listen to the Board. The Board is not making major changes, all the Board wants to do is get the definitions correct and allow us to comply with the National Standards and the Model Law that all the other states are doing, which is basically education.

Mr. Hallisey stated that every time the Board's legislative proposal comes up, the Department doesn't seem to get it into their package, although the Department may support it, it does not get into their bills. Mr. Hallisey requested a copy of the actual legislative proposal so that he may provide a copy to one of the senators on the general law committee, who can review it and become familiar with it. Atty. Schwane will provide the most current revision to Mr. Hallisey.

Mr. Padula stated that he understands that the Board's bill is important and will assist the Board.

Motion made by (1) and seconded by (5) to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried.

Meeting adjourned at 11:40 am
