Enclosed is the Memorandum of Decision dated February 3, 2022, concerning the formal administrative hearing held on November 4, 2021 in front of the Liquor Control Commission.

In its decision, the Commission **GRANTS** the Remonstrance and **DENIES** the renewal the liquor permit of Grand Café, Cruz A. Vasquez, Permittee subject to any agent's requirements.

You may request that the Department reconsider its decision¹. The reconsideration request must be sent in writing within fifteen (15) calendar days from the date of this letter. Late requests will not be reconsidered. Reconsideration requests must be sent to: Legal Director, Department of Consumer Protection 450 Columbus Boulevard, Suite 901, Hartford, Connecticut 06103-1840.

The request should state the specific reasons for reconsideration. The Commissioner may reconsider the decision if:

- 1) An error of fact or law should be corrected;
- 2) New evidence has been discovered which materially affects the merits of the case and which, for good reasons, was not presented in the agency proceeding; or
- 3) Other good cause for reconsideration has been shown.

If you do not request reconsideration, you may appeal the decision to the Superior Court of the State of Connecticut. Any appeal must strictly comply with all of the applicable statutory procedures, requirements, and time frames. You may wish to consult an attorney regarding the proper filing of an administrative appeal.
