Kristina Newman-Scott stated that for next year we will be moving the event to a new venue; most likely the Convention Center in Hartford. COA's goal is to increase participation to 800 people. In addition, CT Arts Day will be held in April rather than March. COA will be creating a task force of about 15 people, which will include staff, board members, and legislators

Kristina reported that on Thursday, March 16th, the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) held a national conference call to give an update regarding the President's FY 2018 budget which proposes the elimination of the NEA. Laura Scanlan, Director of State and Regional Partnerships at the NEA, informed the NEA has funds in place for FY18. However, there is a possibility of a government shutdown for April and therefore are proceeding cautiously.

Kristina and Bonnie Koba will be attending Arts Advocacy Day in Washington, DC next week and hope to be able to share a better and clearer update on the status of the NEA at the next board meeting.
