SHPO Strategic Plan Update



CT Architecture: Stories of 100 Places

On November 6, the SHPO's statutory partner, the Connecticut Trust for Historic Preservation. will unveil Connecticut Architecture: Stories of 100 Places, the first comprehensive illustrated book about the state's rich and diverse architectural heritage. Written by Christopher Wigren, the Trust's deputy director, the book introduces readers to 100 places across Connecticut, ranging from Colonial churches and Modernist houses to 19th-century factories, tobacco sheds, town greens, and corporate headquarters. The text draws on architectural survey and National and State Register programs



administered by the SHPO to emphasize the importance of the built environment for our sense of place. The Trust will celebrate with a book launch party on November 6 from 5:00 to 7:00 at the Samuel Russell house in Middletown. New to the National Register of Historic Places

Cypress Cemetery, Old Saybrook

Cypress Cemetery, located on Saybrook Point overlooking South Cove, was listed on the National Register of Historic Places on October 2nd. It is an unplanned cemetery with burials and monuments dating from the 17th century to the present. It is significant on the local level for demonstrating the evolution of funerary art over three centuries.
