Payment Backlog Resolution



- CSE experienced a delay with receiving payment check from DEEP impacting the timeframe for approving applications from 7/13/21 – 8/16/21.
- Adjustments made include: wire transfer and an increasing the threshold for requesting additional funds for CSE when remaining funds reach \$100K.
- CSE has resumed processing rebate payments on a weekly schedule.




