The Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (DEEP) hereby submits its Exceptional Events Demonstration for the Greater Connecticut Nonattainment Area for the 2023 Ozone Season (Demonstration) pursuant to the requirements set forth in the <u>Exceptional Events Rule</u> at 40 CFR 50.14.

DEEP worked closely with your staff in developing the draft Demonstration for public comment, which was posted to DEEP's website for a 30-day public comment period from April 9, 2024 to May 10, 2024.
