## Notice of Intent to Request Redesignation to the Status of Attainment for the Fine Particulate Matter (PM<sub>2.5</sub>) National Ambient Air Quality Standard

The Commissioner of the Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (the Department) hereby gives notice of intent to request redesignation for portions of the State from nonattainment to attainment with respect to the 1997 annual and the 2006 24-hour PM<sub>2.5</sub> National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS). This revision to the State Implementation Plan (SIP) will be submitted to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency for review and approval.

Section 107(d)(3) of the federal Clean Air Act (CAA) provides the requirements for said request: 1) air quality data must demonstrate that the area has attained the NAAQS; 2) the applicable implementation plan is fully approved (as required under CAA section 110(k)); 3) the air quality improvements are due to permanent and enforceable emission reductions; 4) a fully approvable maintenance plan (as required under CAA section 175A) has been submitted; and 5) the State has met all applicable requirements under CAA section 110 and part D. All of these requirements are addressed and satisfied in the proposed SIP revision.
