#### Source Reporting Requirements 2015

- Sources in Table II.A of your Title V permit with source specific requirements
- Sources operating under a permit-by-rule limit, (i.e. 3b or 3c)
- Sources already identified at your site in the DEEP inventory (EMIT)



#### Source Reporting Requirements, cont.

 Any new source that has been added to your site since your Title V permit was issued, that has source specific requirements (i.e. is subject to a New Source Review Permit (NSR), or section 3b or 3c of our regulations, NOx RACT, VOC RACT, etc.)



#### Source Reporting Requirements, cont.

 A source or group of similar sources that emit greater than or equal to 0.5 tons/yr. of actual annual emissions of one or more of the following: NOx, SO2, CO, PM10 primary, VOC or lead, respectively.



#### Why The Update?

- To clearly explain to all reporters which sources require annual emissions reporting and which do not.
- To ensure that fees are assessed on an equitable estimate of each site's actual emissions.



#### Why the Update?, Cont.

 There are some significant emitting sources that are listed under the premise wide applicability section of their Title V permit. Under the previous reporting policy these sources would not have had to be reported. We wanted to ensure that these sources are reported.



#### **Emission Reporting Requirements**

 Emission statement reporting requirements through history



#### Prior to Title V Permit Program

- Registered/permitted and unregistered operations to the extent quantifiable at the facility should be reported.
- DEEP advised sites to include sources or grouped sources that emitted 0.1 tons/year or more of a criteria pollutant.



### From Title V Applications through 2008

- All emitting units identified on the facility's
   Title V application (including any changes in
   operation since filing of the application).
- Or if the Title V permit has been issued, all emitting units identified on the Title V permit.



#### Reporting Requirement 2009 - 2014

 Sites did not have to report sources listed in Section II under the heading "All applicable requirements for the following units are listed in the premises-wide general requirements portion of this Title V permit." This is the small source list that has been added to the Title V renewal permit.
