Emission Statement Facts

- All Title V and GPLPE compliance reports must be submitted electronically through EMIT.
- Annual Title V emissions statements and GPLPE cert. and/or reports are due 3/1/2018.

Forms required to Change Company Info.

- When requesting a formal change to:
 - a Company's name
 - an Individual's name, or
 - a Company/Individual's Information

Source Reporting Requirements 2017

- There are no new reporting requirements for 2017 data versus prior years.
 - Sources in Table II.A of your Title V permit
 - Sources operating under a permit-by-rule
 - Sources already identified at your site in EMIT
 - Any new sources added to your site since your
 Title V permit was last issued.
 - Any source or group of similar sources >0.5 TPY.



Why 2017 Emissions Reporting Matters

- NEI is a triennial reporting program, from which EPA constructs its complete National Emissions Inventory.
- 2017 HAP Emissions will support the National Air Toxics Assessment (2017 NATA).
- Further highlights the importance of control equipment, stack parameters, and other facility data for the triennial reporting period.



Other additional topics

- We ask that you please contact DEEP before making any SCC or control measure changes.
- EMIT's design prohibits effective communication of current / expired SCCs and control measures, which can complicate the selection of the proper SCC / control device.
