Emissions Test Reporting

1. Current State:

- E-mailed reports to group (<u>DEEP.SEM@ct.gov</u>) or individuals;
- Hand delivered/Fed Ex;
- CD submissions with and without hardcopy pages;
- Mailed via USPS
- Reports often addressed to wrong addressee/group
- 2. Time consuming looking into multiple places;
- 3. Challenge to track and file multiple formats;
- 4. Lack of transparency and access to test results within and outside of DEEP (ex. FOIA)



DEEP.SEM@ct.gov - Limitations

Intent of new forms was to require protocol and test report submissions to the DEEP.SEM@ct.gov was recognized as a *problem for sources*:

- 1. Large reports sometimes get bounced back to sender;
- Testers often have to split the reports into multiple attachments;
- 3. Sometimes reports get sent to the case manager (test auditor/protocol reviewer);
 - Results in overlooked reports
 - Delayed assignments

File Transfer Protocol - FTP

To resolve these issues:


- File transfer protocol was established (FTP);
- 2. Aligns with other Bureaus in the Department (UST reports);
- Large documents can be uploaded size not restricted (5 GB limit!);
- Electronic Reports in the ERT format can be uploaded (a tool required by EPA for Federal Rules);
- Peace of mind and easy;
- No more dealing with storage devices; and
- 7. No more last minute paper report deliveries to 79 Elm!

New Forms and Guidelines

Target for release by February:

- New ITT and Report Certification Forms;
- 2. Test Guidelines version 2.0;
- 3. FTP reporting instructions;
- 4. Response to public comments



Don't Worry

Step by step:



- New forms once finalized will be gradually phased in but strongly encouraged;
 - Will expedite protocol approvals!
- 2. Submittals of test reports will be required to our FTP site but generous time will be provided to acclimatize to it;
- 3. FTP instructions will be provided via Ms. Knight, on the SIPRAC website, on the DEEP website, and will also be emailed.

Other Update

Relative Accuracy Test Audit Issue

- 1. Ammonia CEMS No promulgated PS
- However, RCSA Section 22a-174-4 requires that a PS be identified and used in a CEMS Plan and annual RATA;
- 3. Compliance is required with this PS;
- 4. We will be doing outreach to ensure that sources have updated CEMS plans with the DEEP
 - Initial outreach will be to combustion turbines equipped with NH3 CEMS
