Two SIP Revisions Proposed

- A notice of intent was posted August 10, 2020 inviting comment on two State Implementation Plan (SIP) revisions. https://portal.ct.gov/DEEP/Public-Notices/Public-Notices-Proposed-Actions---Opportunity-for-Comment/Proposed-State-Implementation-Plan-SIP-Revisions/Notice-of-Intent-to-Revise-the-State-Implementation-Plan-for-Air-Quality
- Both SIP revisions are required under the Clean Air Act as a result two actions:
 - Reclassification of Connecticut to serious nonattainment for the 2008 ozone national ambient air quality standards (NAAQS).
 - Classification of Connecticut as marginal (Greater CT area) and moderate (NY-NJ-LI area) nonattainment for the 2015 ozone NAAQS.



RACT SIP

- The last reasonably available control technology (RACT) review was completed in 2014 for the initial designations under the 2008 ozone NAAQS.
 - Adoption of RCSA sections 22a-174-22e and 22a-174-22f.
 - NOx standards in RCSA section 22a-174-38 updated.
- This review finds no RACT deficiencies in existing NOx and VOC standards for major sources of NOx or VOC or sources subject to a Control Techniques Guideline.
 - One caveat: If the OTC recommends a new control strategy in the near future, we need to consider it for the 2015 ozone NAAQS.

Nonattainment New Source Review Program Adequacy

- A certification that the existing nonattainment new source review (NNSR) program meets the requirements of 40 CFR 51.165.
- Our NNSR program uses the serious and severe classifications from the 1-hour ozone NAAQS, which is why no change is required, despite the reclassification to serious nonattainment for the 2008 ozone NAAQS.
