GPLPE Replacement Regulations:

RCSA Sections 22a-174-33a and -33b

Status

The proposal was rejected without prejudice on July 30, 2020 and resubmitted to the Legislative Regulation Review Committee for approval on August 20, 2020.



Next Steps

Upon approval, the proposal will be submitted to the Secretary of the State for publication on the CT eRegulations portal, at which point the proposed regulations will become effective.



NSR Permitting Exemptions for Incinerators:

RCSA Sections 22a-174-1 and -3a

Proposal Highlights

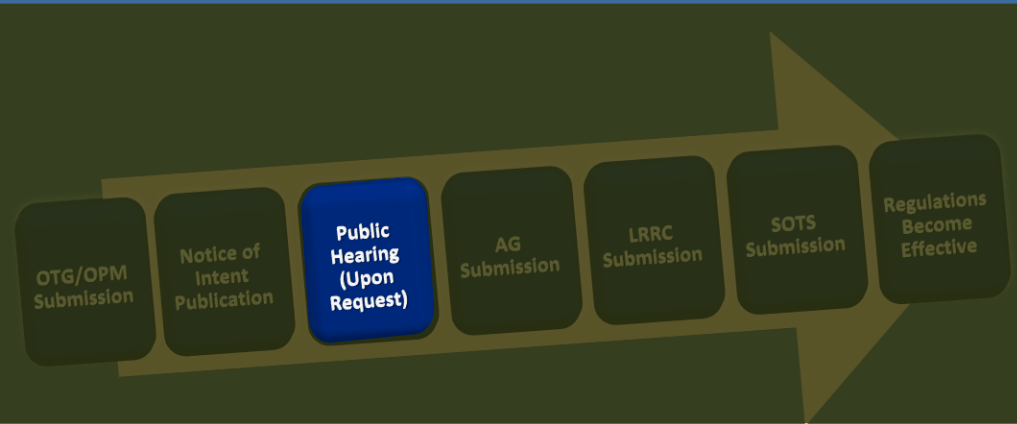
- Four new categories of incinerators to be exempt. Incinerators used:
 - (1) As burn-off ovens;
 - (2) For bench scale R&D operations;
 - (3) For conducting QC or performance testing; and
 - (4) To destroy contraband or confiscated goods.
- With potential emissions of less than 15 tons per year and that meet the requirements of RCSA Section 22a-174-3a(a)(1)(G).
- Does not include crematories or air curtain incinerators.



NSR Permitting Exemptions for Incinerators:

RCSA Sections 22a-174-1 and -3a Status

- No requests for a public hearing were received by the specified deadline.
