

National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants for Stationary Combustion **Turbines** (Subpart YYYY); Amendments

Amendments

- On March 9, 2022, the U.S. EPA removed a stay of formaldehyde standards in NESHAP Subpart YYYY for Stationary Combustion Turbines located at major sources of HAP emissions (87 FR 13183)
- Stay applied to two subcategories of turbines
 - New lean premix gas-fired turbines
 - ▶ New diffusion flame gas-fired turbines
- New or reconstructed = commenced construction/reconstruction of the stationary combustion turbine after January 14, 2003
- Lean premix gas-fired turbine and diffusion flame gas-fired turbine are defined in the regulation
- Effective Date of Rule: March 9, 2022

Compliance Demonstration(§§ 63.6110 & 63.6115)

Initial performance test must be conducted within 180 calendar days of the effective date of rule, March 9, 2022 => Deadline September 5, 2022

Subsequent performance tests must be conducted annually

Test Requirements (§ 63.6120)

- Emissions Limit: ≤ 91 ppbvd @15% O2
- Test Methods: Table 3 to Subpart YYYY
 - Formaldehyde concentration must be corrected to 15% O2, dry basis
 - Sampling site must be located at the outlet of the air pollution control device, if an APCE is present
 - O2 and Moisture must be measured at the same time as the performance test
- Operating Load: at high load, defined as 100% +/- 10%
- Three Test Runs and each test run must be at least 1 hour

Required Test Program Notifications/ Reports

- A notification of intent to test for an initial performance test: at least 60 calendar days before the scheduled initial performance test date as required in § 63.7(b)(1). Required to be sent to both EPA and DEEP:

- Performance test results (and a NOCS) must be submitted before the close of business on the 60th calendar day following the completion of the performance test to both EPA and DEEP:
 - 1. CEDRI (https://cdx.epa.gov/) as specified in §§ 63.6150(f)(1) thru (3); and
 - SEM Compliance Certification Form for Emissions Test Results
