## TITLE V EMISSIONS REPORTING AND FEES

EPA's CAAA of 1990 established federal rules requiring states to collect annual fees based on actual criteria pollutant emissions every calendar year.

The total revenue from these fees must sufficiently cover the entire cost of administering the state's Title V program.

The process for assessing Title V fees is specified in §22a-174-26 of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies (RCSA).


## FACTS AND FIGURES FOR 2023 TITLE V FEES

•We plan to complete our QA/QC process for 2023 data review soon.

- Subsequently the Inventory Stabilization Factor (ISF) will be determined.
  - If unadjusted by the DEEP Commissioner the ISF will equal 133,665/(2023 TOTAL).
  - The actual ISF is typically reduced by our DEEP Commissioner K. Dykes, to meet required program expenses..
- •A total of 60 Title V sites will be receiving fee invoices for 2023 emissions.
- All invoices are planned for E-delivery by DEEP in May.

Per Section 22a-174-26, all 2023 Emissions Fees are due July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024.


### HISTORY OF TONS BILLED AT TITLE V SOURCES
