The Department of Energy and Environmental Protection Boating Division is happy to announce that the Student Ambassador program will be continuing for the 2015-2016 school year. The Student Ambassador Program provides an opportunity for high and middle school students needing to complete a senior year or school community projects, while delivering important boating safety messages to students throughout their school.

Becoming a Student Ambassador is a simple process. Participating Schools appoint a maximum of three students to be a DEEP Student Ambassador for their school, submit their name(s) to the Boating Division, and the Boating Division provides support to the student to successfully complete a boating safety project. Once projects are completed, the Student Ambassador's work is displayed at their school, and the student receives a certificate from the Commissioner of the DEEP for their work. Launched in 2015, the Student Ambassador's projects were also on display at the Legislature Office Building. Students walk away with a sense of pride for being selected, providing information to their peers and will acquire a valuable distinction for their resumes.
