Timeline for sector and WG reports

- Timeline for sector and Working Group reports.
 - 1. Sector teams submit draft reports to Mitigation WG, July 29
 - 2. Sector teams continue to refine drafts, if they wish, July 29 Aug. 10
 - 3. WG submits first draft of report to EEJ & Science/Tech WGs, Aug. 12
 - 4. Sector teams respond to EEJ and Sci/Tech WG feedback, Aug. 12 Sept. 10
 - 5. Public comment period and WG presents draft recommendations to GC3, Sep. 10 Oct. 19
 - 6. WG presents final report to GC3, Nov. 6.
 - 7. Phase 1 report presented to Governor, Jan. 2021
- Tony Cherolis suggests developing a readable and less technical executive summary
 of the mitigation report in order to facilitate more meaningful public comment.
 Brenda Watson and Lisa Hayden concur.
- Tom Swarr suggests focusing on broad public outreach during phase 2. Advocacy network might be better prepared to make the report more accessible and to get the public more engaged.
- Bill Finch suggests creating a single one-page flyer with a simple, consolidated message would be most effective. Perhaps focus on how a specific recommendation can save an individual money in energy costs.
- Kathy Fay asks, how do we message how broadly applicable GC3 is? And how will we make sure that people can find all of the areas on which we are soliciting public comment?
- Jon Slifka asks whether GC3 we be staggering release of WG reports, or whether WG reports be competing with each other for the public's attention. Rebecca French indicates they will be released simultaneously.

Sector reports

Status updates:

• Buildings (Bernie Pelletier, People's Action for Clean Energy) — 40 page document needs to be whittled down to 15.

- Cross and Non-Energy (Charles Rothenberger, CT Fund for the Environment) Draft expected to be sent to the team by today. Meeting on July 29 and will send by COB on Wednesday.
- Electricity (Dino Pascua, CT DEEP) Draft being developed.
- Transportation (John Humphries, CT Roundtable on Climate and Jobs) Equity considerations built in from beginning. Reviewing EEJ recommendations tomorrow to implement into the draft report. Anticipating initial draft for Wednesday.

Organization of reports:

- Minimize the number of new recommendations brought forward; reframe some recommendations as strategies. 12-15 pages per team. Teams have flexibility in where and how to cover equity and adaptation/resilience.
- For Sept. 10, will include summary table, glossary of acronyms, and appendices.

Prioritization of recommendations:

• Tentative prioritization helpful for July 29 draft and needed for Aug. 10 draft. Address: (a) equity and environmental justice; emissions reduction efficacy; enhancement of adaptation and resilience.

Team work beyond July 29 — Main focus has been preparation of reports due July 29, but additional efforts will be very helpful: further refining texts; responding to feedback from EEJ and S&T WGs; reviewing edits.

Working Group report

Aug. 12 draft — For review by Equity & Environmental Justice and Science & Technology WGs. Will be primarily a compilation of team reports, with tentative introduction and minimal editing.

Sept. 10 draft — For public comment. Will be fully edited, and presumably will require WG to be make decisions on: incorporating EEJ and S&T WG feedback; streamlining; review of edits; etc.

Next meeting

Next meeting of Mitigation WG scheduled for Aug. 25. At that point WG will be incorporating feedback from EEJ and S&T for the documents that will go out for public comment. Invitation for meeting has already been sent out. If you don't have it email leff.L.Howard@ct.gov.
