 - Allow for one month of public review
 - o EEJ Adaptation, EEJ Mapping and PH&S co-chairs forum October 5, 4-6 pm
 - Resilient Connecticut-hosted Climate Change and Public Health mini-webinar series will run throughout the month of September

 - o There will also be climate justice webinar series from September through November
- Introduction to EPA RAINE Database, Jeri Weiss
 - Climate Change: Resilience and Adaptation in New England (RAINE)
 - A database of reports and plans that focus on climate change at local, state, and regional levels
 - Able to search the RAINE database and refine search based on a number of factors including state, population, type of community, topics, and more
- EEJ Presentation Review and Questions
 - Review of the presentation present at the GC3 meeting two weeks ago
 - Questions & Comments about extreme heat brought up during the meeting included:
 - Concern about the heat index and how it harms LMI populations
 - Hartford has 15% reduction in energy use could reduce health impacts by \$73 per captia annually 15th highest in the nation among large metro areas
 - Flooding and soil absorbency/surface permeability is a concern
 - Solar panels reduces GHG emissions an reduces heat islands according to one report
 - The meeting notes more details about the comments
 - It is important to note the different between mitigation and adaptation and this WG's scope does not include mitigation because this WG was originally a part of the Adaptation Working Group
 - There is a place to mention ideas/recommendations that involve the adaptationmitigation nexus
 - There are several comments about air quality that were brought up during the meeting:
 - Question about cumulative impacts and putting forth a recommendation
 - Health vulnerabilities and vulnerable population comments
 - Indoor air quality, housing issues & energy issues, and GHHI Project
 - Vector Comments and Questions
 - How do we think about vector illnesses with an equity lens?
 - This is a point that should be addressed in the final report
 - Goudarz Molaei Comment about how vector-borne diseases presentation was not appropriately covered and inaccurate in some areas

- Laura Hayes suggestion about how all of the subject matter experts and team leads will have a chance to review the slides before it is presented again to the public
- It is important that we are inclusive of everyone's comments and expertise
- Rebecca French to set up a forum for potential breakout sessions with subject matter experts
- Extreme events comments and Questions
 - No comments or questions related to waterborne illnesses
- Nutrition and food security comments and questions
 - Food security is a major issue
 - Food hub at Northwest Hills COG
 - Federal food security
 - Martha Page there is regional work on food security/food access and climate change
 - Kristin DeRosia-Banick the CT Department of Agriculture is also leading a Food Systems Team and have been working initially on urgent COVID food insecurity response and eventually long-term food security, EEJ, and farmers to communities in need and would be happy to contribute to the conversation

 - Who will carry out these recommendations?
 - Who to follow-up? What agency will be responsible for following up with these recommendations?
 - Multiple agencies will be involved with following up
 - Might be helpful to have a lead party/agency to take the lead to ensure that there is actual follow through
 - Much overlap with the Natural and Working Land group. How do you envision that the work is coordinated?

- The draft report was shared with everyone and with the EEJ group
 - Important that everyone in the working group has a chance to review the recommendations
- We have additional written suggested recommendations from different working group members
