Rebecca French: The objective is to produce a framework instead of a full vulnerability assessment. We should try to address membership gaps in this meeting.

Brenda Bergeron: What are the vulnerable assets that we need to track? Defining vulnerable and then the state-owned assets is a little tricky in Connecticut.

David Barkin: We should add representatives from UConn to the working group member list Todd Berman: Also add a representative from the siting council Kim Lesay: Add a representative from CT Airport Authority

Scott Gaul presents the data available on state-owned assets.

- There is some data on state-owned assets available
- Mapped out where state-owned property and lands are located
- Presents the breakdown of property by agency
- Presents a graph of state-owned lands by use with largest being used for Recreation

Mary-beth Hart: The working group should have equity and environmental justice represented and possibly reach out to the Department of Developmental services

CIRCA Vulnerability Assessment

John Truscinski, Connecticut Institute for Resilience and Climate Adaptation, presents on the work CIRCA has done.

- Providing background on CIRCA work on a vulnerability assessment
- Connect the work of Resilient CT to this group

- CIRCA has focused on vulnerabilities to regional infrastructure of Fairfield and New Haven counties
- This includes social vulnerabilities as well as physical
- Developing a Resilience Toolkit for Municipalities
- Developing the mapping capacity with a climate change vulnerability index

Bryan Garcia: Can we get information on the amount of uninsured property (flood insurance) at the Department of Insurance

Karen Michaels: That is protected information.

David Barkin: For this discussion, it may not be relevant because we are dealing with state property

Scott Gaul: How difficult expanding vulnerability assessment beyond New Haven and Fairfield counties

John Truscinski: It would take a long time maybe 6 months to a year and we don't have non-critical state property data

Rebecca French: This is a framework exercise that can include recommendation of what Connecticut should include in the vulnerability assessment. May not just be a discussion of physical climate risk.
