COVID-19 protocol. The New London in-person discussion will be held indoors at the O.I.C. building. All local COVID-19 orders will be observed. As of Monday, August 23, face coverings are required indoors in New London for everyone two years of age and older, regardless of vaccination status. Registration will be limited to 30 people to maximize social distancing. Face coverings will be provided. Individual boxed meals provided can be consumed outside or in socially distanced locations indoors before the discussion begins. The Groton in-person discussion will be held outdoors in Washington Park in a covered pavilion. In keeping with CT DEEP-sponsored outdoor events at state parks, DEEP requests that face coverings be worn by all attendees, regardless of vaccination status, when less than 6 feet of distance cannot be maintained between attendees. Face coverings will be provided.

The State of Connecticut affirms that getting vaccinated is <u>safe</u>, the most <u>effective</u> way to prevent serious illness and death from COVID-19, and there is <u>no cost</u> to get vaccinated.
