Additional e-Filing Types

Select e-Filing Type

- Boating & Fishing**
Inland Fish Tournament, Marine Fish Derby, Marine Event, Liberation Permit, Importation Permit, Special Regulations Permit, and Private Waters Registrations
- Bureau of Energy and Technology Policy (BETP)**
Energy Policy - Comprehensive Energy Strategy, Integrated Resources Plan, Microgrid Program, Conservation and Load Management Plan, Federal Weatherization Assistance Program, Renewable Resources, Climate Change and Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative
- Emissions Inventory (EMIT)**
EMIT is Connecticut's web based air emissions reporting application. The EMIT application supports filing of air emissions statements and Title V and GPLPE air compliance reporting.
- Environmental Adjudications**
Documents in hearings regarding environmental permits and enforcement, hunting, fishing and boating matters, and licenses administered by the DEEP
- Public Utilities Regulatory Authority (PURA)**
Regulation of Electric, Gas and Water utilities, also Cable and Telecommunications providers; duties include oversight of electric suppliers and aggregators, Renewable Energy Source certification, and Consumer Services
- Radiation**
Diagnostic & Therapeutic X-Ray Device (DTX) and Radioactive Material & Industrial X-Ray Device (RMI) Registrations
- Stormwater**
Stormwater Construction, Industrial, and No Exposure Registrations
- Underground Storage Tank**
Underground Storage Tank Notifications
- Hazardous Waste Transporters**
Hazardous Waste, Non-Hazardous Waste, Spill Contractor Permit, Biomedical Waste Transporter Permits
- Aquatic Pesticides**
Regulates the use of chemicals proposed for introduction into the waters of the state, whether public or private, for control of aquatic organisms
- Coastal Activities**
Structures, Dredging & Fill; Tidal Wetlands; Section 401 Water Quality Certificate (Tidal); and Certificate of Permission

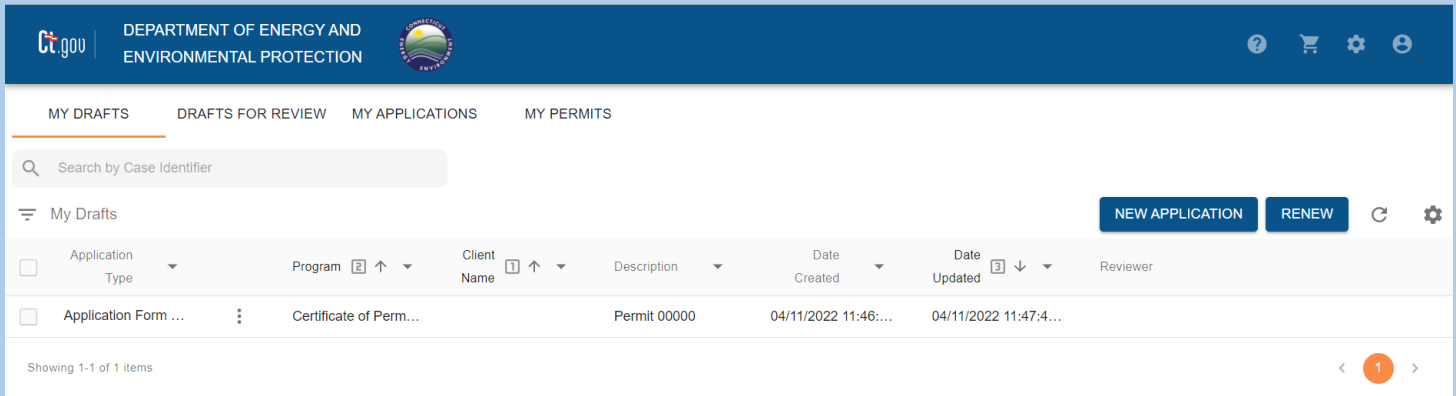

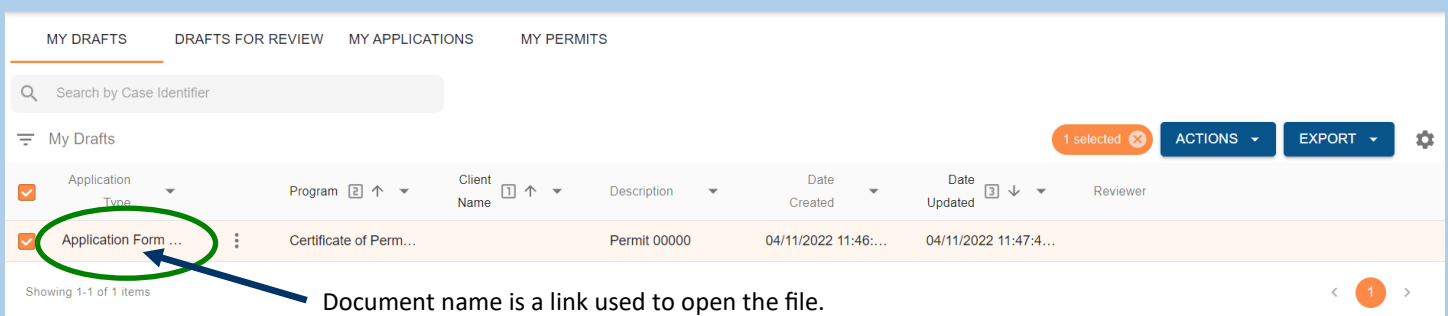
Coastal Activities Page

Frequently Asked Questions

What is a subscriber agreement?

A Subscriber Agreement allows persons to use an eSignature to submit Electronic Filings to the Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection.

What is a signatory authority?

For businesses registered with the Secretary of the State (SOTS), the person should be identified on SOTS as Signatory Authority.

If you have signatory authority, it means that given your position at a company/organization, you have the authority to sign documents of this level on behalf of the company/entity.

I am a consultant, which option should I chose?

If you are a consultant acting on behalf of your client- when asked if you have signatory authority, say no, and select representative. If the applicant has given permission to the consultant to submit the application, select yes to, "I have been given delegated signatory authority."

What's an environmental filing?

The environmental filing question listed in the Subscriber Agreement set up is not necessary for LWRD applications. Select "No" unless you are filing a different type of application. At this time, Underground Storage Tanks (UST) and Stormwater filings require this type of Subscriber Agreement, however, this is not necessary for LWRD applications.
