REBUTTAL

A challenge that is not rebutted within the rebuttal period is sustained.

### **CHALLENGE** PHASE

FOR ELIGIBLE CHALLENGERS

DEEP defines the level of evidence needed for a challenge.

A permissible challenger submits a challenge to DEEP's online portal and the location becomes challenged. These challenges are visible to the relevant ISP.

#### **FINAL** DETERMINATION

DEEP will either sustain the disputed locations or reject the dispute.

The outcome determines the locations and community anchor institutions in Connecticut that are eligible for BEAD funding.
