# NOTICE OF TECHNICAL MEETING ON DECEMBER 15, 2022

Under section 16a-3d of the Connecticut General Statutes, the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (DEEP) is charged with preparing a <u>Comprehensive Energy Strategy</u> (CES). The CES examines future energy needs in the state and identifies opportunities to reduce ratepayer costs, ensure reliable energy availability, and mitigate the public health and environmental impacts of Connecticut's energy use, such as impacts from emission of greenhouse gases and criteria air pollutants.

The agency held a Scoping Meeting for the 2022 CES on January 6, 2022 (<u>notice</u>). DEEP subsequently has held a series of technical meetings on hydrogen, end uses that are hard to decarbonize, building thermal decarbonization, active demand response, and alternative fuels: April 6, 2022 (hydrogen), September 1, 2022 (end uses that are hard to decarbonize), September 22, 2022 (building thermal decarbonization – heat pump barriers and market strategies), September 23, 2022 (building thermal decarbonization – heat pumps [continued]; support strategies), November 3 (active demand response), and November 4 (alternative fuels) (see previous notices: <u>hydrogen</u>; <u>technical meetings 1-4</u>; <u>technical meetings 5-6</u>). Technical Meeting 4 on building thermal decarbonization economic potential and technology deployment targets was canceled (<u>notice</u>); and an additional opportunity for written comment on that topic was issued October 28, 2022 (<u>notice</u>). An upcoming technical session on methane/natural gas distribution planning and policies has also been scheduled for December 8, 2022 (<u>notice</u>).

By way of today's notice, DEEP invites stakeholder participation in an additional technical session on **December 15, 2022** from **9 a.m. to 5 p.m.** on market-based decarbonization programs and low-carbon incentives (technical session #8) that will inform development of key elements of the CES. DEEP also expects to use information gathered during this technical session to inform other energy planning processes, such as future <u>Conservation & Load Management Plans</u> and <u>Integrated Resource Plans</u>. Please see the detailed invitation below regarding presentation proposals and written comments related to this technical session. DEEP will announce a more extensive agenda for this meeting in the coming weeks.

**Invitation for presentations** – As described in this notice, DEEP is inviting presentation proposals for specific portions of the agenda for Technical Session 8.

**Zoom** – The session will be held via Zoom. Individuals wishing to attend are required to register via the link provided below. Participants must register if they intend to attend.
