

Meeting Notice and Request for Written Comments

Residential and C&I Combined Contractor Technical Advisory Committee

January 25, 2023

Pursuant to Conn. Gen. Stat. § 16-245m, the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (DEEP) is required to review a combined electric and gas Conservation and Load Management (C&LM) Plan. Under § 16-245m, the C&LM Plan implements "cost-effective energy conservation programs, demand management and market transformation initiatives." Eversource Energy, The United Illuminating Company, the Connecticut Natural Gas Corporation, and the Southern Connecticut Gas Company (collectively the "Utilities") develop the C&LM Plan on three-year cycles with guidance from DEEP and the Energy Efficiency Board (EEB) and submit annual updates.

To assist with program implementation, DEEP regularly holds Contractor Technical Advisory Committee (CTAC) meetings with contractors from the Residential and Commercial & Industrial (C&I) sectors. These meetings provide a monthly forum for contractors, the Utilities, and DEEP to discuss matters related to C&LM program implementation. At the onset of the COVID-19 public health crisis, CTAC meetings were also used to discuss program impacts and strategies for a safe return to work.

Going forward, DEEP will continue to use the CTAC process to engage vendors and contractors in discussion surrounding implementation of the C&LM plan. All meetings will be followed by an opportunity to submit public comments to aid DEEP in its ongoing decision-making process. Other stakeholders are welcome to participate as well. The recommendations of this working group and written comments submitted by stakeholders will be informative to DEEP in its continued oversight of the C&LM Plan and programs.

DEEP will hold the next Combined Residential and C&I CTAC meeting, via Zoom webinar, on Wednesday, January 25 at 1:00 PM. The meeting will consist of a discussion of meeting topics for 2023, based on results of a survey sent to over 200 contractors, as well as the transition to new software and the new Residential Energy Preparation Service (REPS). Written comments from stakeholders on these issues will be due on Monday, January 30, 2023. Please submit comments to DEEP.EnergyBureau@ct.gov as a Word or PDF file.
