Background

- The IRA funds are intended for LMI households
 - Energy Burden (National Average)
 - Low-income: 6.7%
 - All others: 2%
- Historically, LMI markets have been underserved
- Market education and contractor support are needed
- Aggregators can help bridge this gap



Our Process

- 1. "Awareness advertising" to LMI households
- 2. Pre-qualify households for IRA, state, utility programs
- 3. Bundle households together to create value for contractors
 - a) Economy of scale to maximize rebate effectiveness
 - b) Consistent, scheduled replacement work
- 4. Qualified contractor(s) perform installations
- 5. We gather photos, invoices, documents, and process all paperwork
- 6. Contractor is paid by FreeHeatPump once state processes rebate



Program Considerations

- Design your program to allow aggregators to assist
 - Allow aggregators to apply for and receive funds directly
 - Aggregators then distribute funds to contractor(s)
- Stack existing incentives
 - Cold-climate heat pumps require larger investment
 - Apply existing EnergizeCT \$750/ton incentive towards HEAR funds
 - Ex: Minnesota additional \$4,000 for ccASHP



Conclusion

- Aggregators add value to the process
 - Homeowners / Property Managers
 - Educate on available programs
 - Arrange all contractors
 - Maximize incentives
 - Contractors
 - Streamline the rebate process
 - Consistent "off-season" opportunities
 - Pre-qualified revenue stream
 - State / Implementer
 - Consistent applications
 - Fewer rejections
 - Better efficiency
