### 2015/2016 LIEAB Recommendations

### Recommendations on Plan

- 1. LIHEAP SNAP Benefits (Section X of the Allocation Plan) LIEAB recommends to continue to provide annual energy assistance benefits of \$20.01 to SNAP eligible households to maximize the Standard Utility Allowance (SUA) used in the calculation of their SNAP benefits.
- 2. LIEAB recommends that the FFY 2016 program closely mirror the three tier level of energy assistance benefits to the extent practicable.

### **Recommendations for DSS**

- 1. LIEAB recommends that the DSS website chart of towns contain a hyperlink to the appropriate cap agency.
- 2. LIEAB again recommends that "Out of Deliverable Fuel" guidelines be added to the desk manual. (The program from which funds are reserved under this subsection shall (1) not later than 48 hours after a household applies for energy crisis benefits, provide some form of assistance that will resolve the energy crisis if such household is eligible to receive such benefits; (2) not later than 18 hours after a household applies for crisis benefits, provide some form of assistance that will resolve the energy crisis if such household is eligible to receive such benefits and is in a life-threatening situation.)
- 3. LIEAB recommends that the energy assistance award letters be updated and simplified (i.e., remove language that award is either Federal or State funding).
- 4. LIEAB recommends making CAPTAIN/FUELWARE programs customizable bythe CAA's.

### **Recommendations to Utility Companies**

- 1. LIEAB continues to recommend that the utilities (CNG, SCG, UI and municipal utility companies) install portals and create designated call-in numbers for use by social service providers to set up payment arrangements and resolve customer problems.
- 2. LIEAB requests that all utility companies have portal availability for the 1<sup>st</sup> day of energy assistance application intake.
- 3. LIEAB requests that the utilities create a written manual for service providers explaining in detail how each of their arrearage forgiveness and matching payment programs work and the eligibility guidelines for each program. LIEAB also requests that a link to this information and guidelines be accessible on the portal.

- 4. LIEAB requests that the utilities create tutorials for service providers to coordinate with their written arrearage forgiveness and matching payment programs.
- 5. LIEAB requests a streamlining of hardship coding with CNG, SCG, UI and Eversource.

### Recommendations for Energy Efficiency Funds


1. LIEAB has concerns that the LIHEAP monies diverted to energy efficiency funding may reduce energy assistance benefits for the poorest households needing such assistance;

### It is therefore recommended that:

- a. If there is a ten percent (10%) requirement to fund energy efficiency programs with LIHEAP monies, LIEAB should continue looking at different options for utilization of these funds.
- b. If there is not a ten percent (10%) requirement to fund energy efficiency programs with LIHEAP monies, LIEAB may still want to look at using a percentage of monies to fund repair/replacement of low efficiency furnaces.
