3. Weatherization Assistance	Becca Trietch, from DEEP, presented on	
Program	<u>Weatherization Program</u> which is a	
	federally funded program that assists in	
	providing energy efficiency of dwellings	
	and safety barrier remediation to allow	
	for energy efficiency upgrades. The	
	dwellings served are single family units	
	that are annually funded through the	
	Department of Energy. Single family is	
	defined as a single-family home up to 4	
	units. The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law	
	(BIL) allows for multi-family dwellings	
	which are 5 or more units to receive WAP	
	benefits. The single family is split into	
	two service providers with an estimated	
	total of \$3.2 million funding. The two	
	service providers can service an average	
	of 130 single family units. We are hoping	
	the multi-family units will have up to a	
	five-year funding under the BIL which is	
	up to \$7.4 million. The service provider	
	would be able to service up to 884 units

	statewide with a service contract for up	
	to 3 years versus a one year. Through the	
	WAP Request for Proposal. The two	
	service providers selected are Community	
	Renewal Team (CRT) and Center for	
	EcoTechnology (CET) to provide services	
	for single family units. The multi-family	
	service provider is the International	
	Center for Appropriate & Sustainable	
	Technology (ICast). While contracts have	
	not been signed we are working under	
	good faith. Contracts are expected to be	
	finalized by early November with a	
	service term of three years to allow for	
	continuity of services. CRT and NOI were	
	the prior service providers for the WAP	
	single family home and they are working	
	together in this transition to help	
	minimize any layoffs during this	
	transitional period.	
	The Technical Consultant Request for	
	Proposal is providing state monitoring for	
	quality assurance/control as well as a	
	variety of technical task. (refer to Pg 7	
	Slide deck). The deadline for proposals to	
	DEEP is October 3, 2023 with a goal to	
	have the technical consultant start as	
	early as 2024.
