

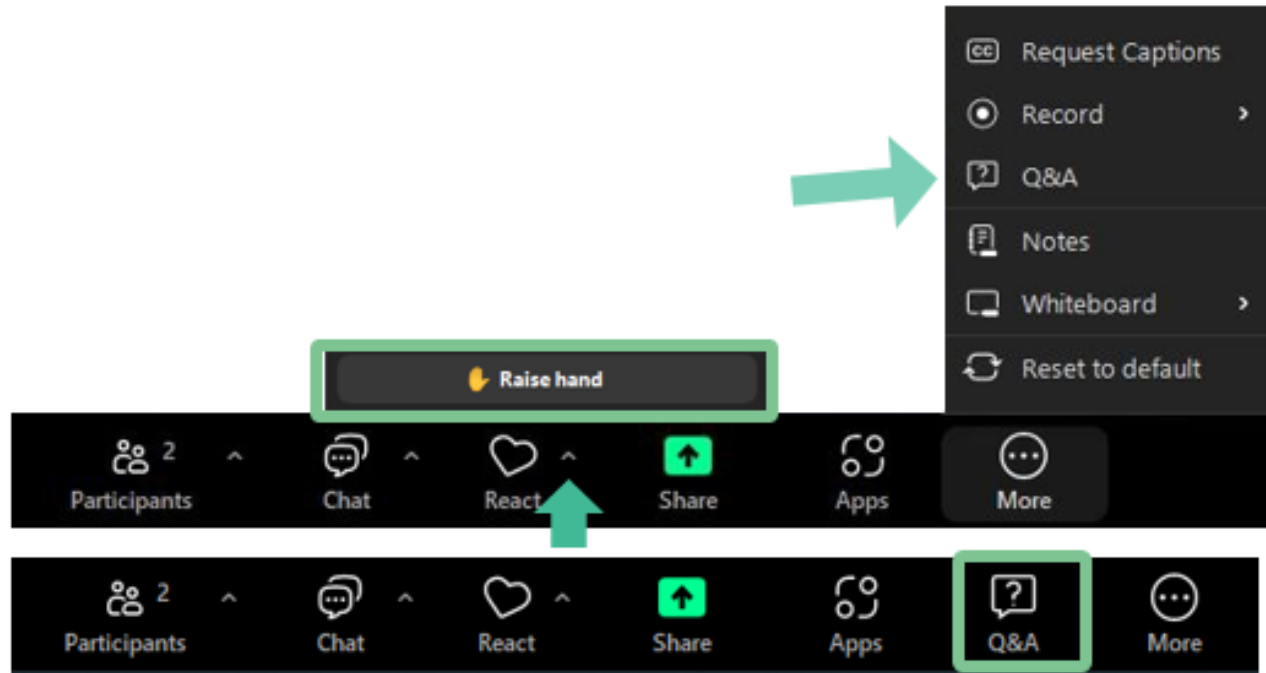

INTRODUCTION

- The State Plan we are discussing today is for the 1-4 Unit Weatherization Assistance Program (formula funds)
- **WAP's Purpose:** To increase the energy efficiency of dwellings owned or occupied by income-eligible persons and to improve their health and safety, especially for individuals and households identified by DOE as vulnerable:
 - Elderly
 - Disabled
 - Young Children
 - High Energy Use
 - High Energy Burden
- **Our State Plan is developed in accordance with federal regulations:**
 - 10 CFR 440 (Program)
 - 2 CFR 200 (Financial)

IMPORTANT NOTE

- As of today, DOE has not issued application instructions or budget allocations for PY26
- On January 23rd, the President signed the Commerce, Justice, Science; Energy and Water Development; and Interior and Environment Appropriations Act for 2026
 - Provided funding to DOE
 - This act allocated \$369M in FY26 to WAP
 - An increase of \$3M over FY25 enacted levels
- CT WAP team has started working on key components of the PY26 State Plan
- However, please note that PY26 will not officially be confirmed until DOE guidance is released

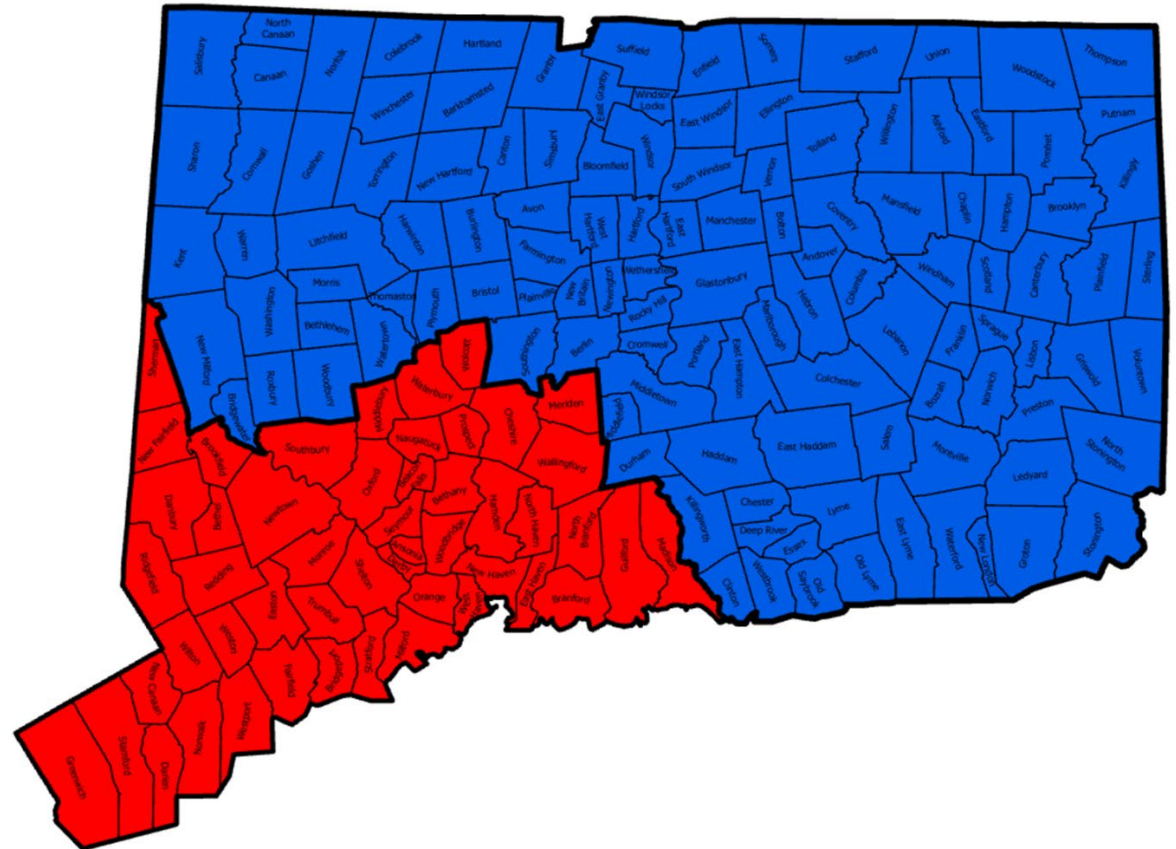

RECENT PROGRAM CHANGES

Advance Accounts

- With the PY25 amendments, DEEP added this option for the Subgrantees
- This is a segregated account that can be used to pay subcontractors before receiving reimbursement from DEEP
- Initial amount of \$200,000 that will be replenished by DEEP once subcontractors have been paid

Monitoring Processes

- During PY25, DEEP worked to update the WAP monitoring process
- Streamlined and coordinated the process between the Subgrantees, AEA, and TVC
- Developed a Project Review Process that will be added to the Hancock software

Software Transition

- In PY25, DEEP received approval to continue utilizing the DOE WAweb suite of software including NEAT/MHEA
- Throughout the Program Year, DEEP worked to make upgrades to Hancock, our data management software
- Upgrades to Hancock include better client file organization and project process tracking

Updated Guidelines

- In PY25, DEEP developed new H&S and WRF guidelines
- These new guidelines provide clarity about the processes when utilizing these funding sources
- Worked with Saturn to get our Field Guide updated

PROPOSED UPCOMING CHANGES

Leveraged Funds

- More cost-shared units with the HES-IE program moving forward
- DEEP may utilize other funding sources to improve WAP services and offer more energy savings measures to customers

RFP for WAP IIJA

- We are working on an RFP for a WAP IIJA service provider
- This will also be made available on our website once completed

Self Intake Application

- DEEP has been working with Hancock developers to launch a self intake application
- This will allow interested people to apply to WAP directly and to apply outside of heating season when the CEAP application is closed

Updated Program Guidelines

- We are working on an updated manual
- It will be made available on our website once it is completed
