

Access and Adoption



Broadband access typically refers to the availability of a physical connection that offers sufficient speeds, latency, and other performance metrics for reliable service.



Broadband adoption involves factors such as affordability, availability of a compatible device, and the digital skills that impact a user's ability to benefit from that access.

Purpose:

For low-income/multi-family curb-to-home and business broadband infrastructure buildout and underserved area broadband infrastructure grants.

Grant Funds:

\$40.8M

Timeline:

Application period estimated to open Q3/Q4 Projects must be completed by the end of 2026

Purpose:

For the buildout of infrastructure to **all unserved and underserved locations**, followed by community anchors and digital equity efforts.

Grant Funds:

\$144M

Initial Proposal Public Comment Period – Fall 2023 Initial Proposal Due – December 27, 2023

BEAD Program

"Underrepresented Communities"

- Individuals who live in covered households*
- Aging individuals**
- Incarcerated individuals, other than individuals who are incarcerated in a Federal correctional facility
- Veterans
- Individuals with disabilities
- Individuals with a language barrier, including individuals who—
 - Are English learners; and
 - Have low levels of literacy
- Individuals who are members of a racial or ethnic minority group
- Individuals who primarily reside in a rural area***

/ Opportunity for Community Organizations



Generally, **Community Anchor Institutions (CAIs)** are nonprofit or governmental community support organizations that <u>facilitate greater</u> use of broadband service by vulnerable populations, including:

- Schools
- Libraries
- Health clinics, hospitals, & other medical providers
- Public safety entities
- Institutions of higher education
- Public housing organizations
- Other community support organizations

CAIs with relevant programming may be eligible for **funding**:

- Connect to 1 Gigabit symmetrical service plans
- Other financial support for digital equity initiatives

/ Digital Equity Status and Next Steps

Outreach and Research

Agency engagement: Indexed existing programs and strategic plans

Partner Survey: Used to develop a "digital equity asset map" of existing programs statewide

Resident Survey: 5,000+ responses addressing barriers to access, devices, and support

Focus Groups: Targeted small-group discussions with members of covered populations

Listening Session: Enlisting subject-matter experts on plan components

Next Steps

Drafting five-year plan addressing Internet, devices, skills, and support

Likely \$17M Award

Considering efficiencies at state, regional, local levels

Leverage existing programs and relationships

Relevance to other priorities (education, workforce, housing, healthcare, etc.)
