## Connecticut CARES Act Assistance to Fishery Participants II Update: Aid Disbursements Mailed March 10, 2022

The Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (DEEP) has completed processing CT CARES Act Assistance to Fishery Participants II (CT CAAFP II) applications.

The Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission (ASMFC) issued and mailed disbursement checks via U.S. Mail to all qualified applicants on March 10, 2022. Checks were mailed to the address specified on the CT CAAFP II application. DEEP expects that qualified applicants should receive their aid disbursements during the week of March 14th.

DEEP will also mail a separate letter to each applicant detailing determinations made on their program eligibility and aid amount, as well as instructions on how to appeal those determinations should an applicant wish to do so.
