Commercial Fishery Scup Possession Limit Increase

NOTICE

Effective 0001 hours, Monday, June 7, 2021, the following possession limits will be in effect for Connecticut's summer commercial scup fishery:

Scup:

- For holders of Scup License Endorsements: 1,500 pounds.
- For Restricted Commercial Fishing License holders: 60 fish.
- From lobster pots when in possession of lobsters: 10 fish.

For current commercial fishery trip limits and quota status:

The Department monitors landings and adjusts trip limits according to Department regulations in an attempt to provide fishing opportunity throughout the year for all participants in the commercial fishery. In addition, the Department strives to provide advance notification of trip limit changes, although this may not always be possible due to rapidly escalating or unanticipated landings. In such circumstances, only a short notification period may be possible.
