Notice to Commercial Fishermen

COMMERCIAL FISHING LICENSE RENEWAL DEADLINE REMINDER

Public Act 15-52, which went into effect on January 1, 2016, requires commercial limited access (moratorium) licenses to be renewed annually by March 31st. License applications MUST BE RECEIVED OR POSTMARKED BY MARCH 31st. The law also requires a Commercial Fishing Vessel Permit to be purchased annually for the primary vessel identified on a limited access (moratorium) license for the license to remain eligible for renewal in the future. Quota Managed Species Endorsements for fluke, scup, and black sea bass also require annual renewal by March 31st. The fee is \$15 per species.
