

## Commercial Scup Fishery Possession Limit Increase

### NOTICE

**Effective 0000 hours, Wednesday, July 31, 2024, the following possession limit will be in effect for Connecticut's commercial scup fishery:**

- 1,500 pounds for holders of a Scup License Endorsement.
- For Restricted Commercial Fishing License holders: 100 fish.
- From lobster pots when in possession of lobsters: 10 fish. This does not apply to personal use lobster license holders.

The Department recently acquired a generous transfer of 200,000 pounds of 2024 summer period scup quota from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

**Federally-permitted seafood dealers are reminded:** [Dealers must submit all reports for a reporting week \(Sunday to Saturday\) by midnight of the following Tuesday.](#) Open link for details.

### REMINDER:

The possession limit applies to the vessel, regardless of how many persons are on board. Possession limits apply per trip or per day, whichever is the longer period of time.

The Department monitors landings and adjusts trip limits according to Department regulations in an attempt to provide fishing opportunity throughout the year for all participants in the commercial fishery. In addition, the Department strives to provide advance notification of trip limit changes, although this may not always be possible due to rapidly escalating or unanticipated landings. In such circumstances, only a short notification period may be possible.
