

Commercial Summer Flounder Fishery Possession Limit Increase

NOTICE

Effective 0001 hours, Sunday, May 18, 2025, the possession limit for the commercial harvest of summer flounder will be increased to 200 pounds. As of Wednesday, May 14, 2025, the Department estimates that 13.3% of Connecticut's 2025 commercial summer flounder quota of 172,074 pounds has been landed.

Federally-permitted seafood dealers are reminded they must submit all reports for a reporting week (Sunday to Saturday) by midnight of the following Tuesday: <https://www.fisheries.noaa.gov/new-england-mid-atlantic/resources-fishing/seafood-dealer-reporting-greater-atlantic-region>

REMINDER:

The possession limit applies to the vessel, regardless of how many persons are on board. Possession limits apply per trip or per day, whichever is the longer period of time.

The Department monitors landings and adjusts trip limits according to Department regulations in an attempt to provide fishing opportunity throughout the year for all participants in the commercial fishery. In addition, the Department strives to provide advance notification of trip limit changes, although this may not always be possible due to rapidly escalating or unanticipated landings. In such circumstances, only a short notification period may be possible.
