# **Commercial Black Sea Bass Possession Limit Change**

### **NOTICE**

Effective 0001 hours, Sunday, July 13, 2025, the possession limit for holders of a Black Sea Bass License Endorsement will be increased from 225 pounds to 300 pounds. See below for more information. As of Wednesday, July 9, 2025, the Department estimates 37.6% of Connecticut's 2025 commercial black sea bass quota has been landed.

### Black Sea Bass possession limits:

- 300 pounds for holders of a Black Sea Bass License Endorsement.
- From lobster pots, when in possession of lobsters: 60 pounds. No Black Sea Bass License Endorsement required. This does not apply to personal use lobster license holders.

Call-in required for Black Sea Bass landings from lobster pots: To provide for timely monitoring of Black Sea Bass landings from lobster pots, the Marine Fisheries Program is continuing the mandatory weekly call-in reporting requirement for black sea bass landings from lobster pots. Any commercial fisherman landing Black Sea Bass from lobster pots is required to contact the Marine Fisheries Program weekly (deadline of 2359 hours on Mondays) by calling 860-447-4323 and leaving a message with the following information: the fisherman's name, commercial fishing plate number, the reporting week ending date (reporting weeks run Sunday through Saturday) and total pounds of Black Sea Bass landed from lobster pots during the reporting week.

### Additional notes concerning Black Sea Bass landings from lobster pots:

- The weekly call-in reporting requirement is implemented under authority of CGS Sec. 26-157b. Failure
  to comply with this reporting requirement is punishable as a Class D misdemeanor and may result in
  commercial fishing license suspension.
- The weekly call-in reporting requirement is not a substitute for other existing reporting requirements.
   Fishermen must still report their landings in monthly commercial logbooks or via electronic vessel trip reports.
- Weekly call-in reports, as well as timely submission of monthly commercial logbooks, are crucial to maintenance of the opportunity for Black Sea Bass landings from lobster pots. Failure on the part of fishery participants to adhere to the weekly call-in requirement or to submit monthly logbooks in a timely manner will lead to discontinuation of the allowance for Black Sea Bass landings from lobster pots.
- Only holders of a Connecticut Commercial Lobster Pot Fishing License, a Connecticut Principal
  Commercial Fishing License, or a Connecticut Restricted Lobster Pot Fishing License may legally fish
  lobster pots in Connecticut state waters and therefore land Black Sea Bass from lobster pots. As a
  reminder, lobster pots must be tagged with current fishing year trap tags issued by the Department or
  New York Department of Environmental Conservation.
- Lobster pots cannot be fished in Connecticut state waters during the fall lobster closure (Sept. 8 Nov. 28, inclusive). Therefore, no Black Sea Bass may be landed from lobster pots during the fall closure.

<u>Federally-licensed seafood dealers are reminded</u>: <u>Dealers must submit all reports for a reporting week</u> (Sunday to Saturday) by midnight of the following Tuesday.

#### **REMINDER:**

The possession limit applies to the vessel, regardless of how many persons are on board. Possession limits apply per trip or per day, whichever is the longer period of time. Transfer of Black Sea Bass between vessels at sea is prohibited.

The Department monitors landings and adjusts trip limits according to Department regulations in an attempt to provide fishing opportunity throughout the year for all participants in the commercial fishery. In addition, the Department strives to provide advance notification of trip limit changes, although this may not always be possible due to rapidly escalating or unanticipated landings. In such circumstances, only a short notification period may be possible.
