## **Quota Managed Species Meeting Notice**

A meeting of seafood dealers and commercial fishermen that harvest quota-managed species has been scheduled for **2 pm**, **Monday**, **December 1**, **2025**, at DEEP Marine Headquarters, Boating Education Center (rear building).

The purpose of this meeting is to receive input on strategies to manage the 2026 commercial quotas, to share access equitably among endorsement holders by season, optimize economic returns, and to prevent fishery closures that could lead to higher discards of fish. We will also discuss trip limits for the final weeks of 2025.

All quota amounts shown are PRELIMINARY and subject to change pending NOAA's final specifications and any state overage adjustments. Because of the federal government shutdown, the following commercial quotas and percent changes are provisional. The Mid-Atlantic Fishery Management Council and Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission have agreed on coastwide commercial quota levels to recommend to NOAA Fisheries, consistent with federal fishery management plan requirements. The proposed 2026 coastwide quotas and Connecticut's share are:
