Site Description: Fort Nathan Hale Park offers on New Haven Harbor offers a sandy beach and a variety of other amenities. Fishing from the access pier is expected to resume late 2017 upon its reconstruction. Bring binoculars for birding, and walk the site's trails. Interpretive signage along the trails educates visitors about on-site habitat and the property's historic and cultural values. A pavilion provides shade from the summer sun. A family friendly playground is available on this site. Sanitary facilities are available.

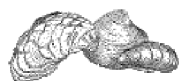

Directions:

From the East: Take I-95 South to exit 51. Stay straight on US-1/Frontage Road. Turn left on Townsend Avenue. Turn right onto Main Street. Turn left onto Woodward Avenue. Follow Woodward Avenue and Fort Hale Park will be on your right where Woodward Avenue turns to Fort Hale Park Road.

From the West: Take I-95 North to exit 50, which is the Woodward Avenue exit. Turn right onto Woodward Avenue. Follow Woodward Avenue and Fort Hale Park will be on your right where Woodward Avenue turns to Fort Hale Park Road.
