
Connecticut Coastal Access Guide

Bluff Point State Park and Reserve Depot Road Groton, CT 06340





Site Description: Located at the end of Depot Road, this approximately 800 acre State reserve lies between the Poquonnock River and Mumford Cove. One of the largest natural areas in the State, it contains not only a variety of wildlife, but also a barrier beach, steep cliffs, forested lands and tidal wetlands. You can paddle up beyond the railroad bridge to the north and down to Bushy Point Beach. Hiking and running trails offer vistas of Long Island Sound, Mumford Cove and the Pequonnock River.


